

Lepus Cornutus: King of the Rabbits

The Lepus Cornutus was once thought to be a mythical creature, like a lot of the creatures we have today. The Lepus Cornutus (also known as a Jackalope in North America, the wolpertinger in The German Allied States, and Mi'raj in the Middle East) is a fast and dangerous creature. It prefers to be left in solitude, but when provoked will defend itself and its den.



The majority of these variants are herbivores and would not hurt another creature. If you are unlucky enough to run into the Mi'raj it is a carnivore and has no qualms about attacking larger creatures for their food.

The Mi'raj hunt in packs of 5-10 animals and have been known to take down creatures as large as a small behemoth. They are not particularly strong creatures, but what they lack in strength they make up for in agility and the uncanny ability to hunt as a team. They almost seem to communicate with each other while hunting.
